Cool Summer Nights at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum Open Summer Saturday Evenings June through August

Tucson, AZ (May 24, 2012) -- Beat the heat and experience the magic of the Sonoran Desert at night beginning Saturday, June 2 at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum. Each Saturday night, June through August, is an entirely different experience with themed activities and programs, some especially for families and children. The museum extends its hours until 10 PM with special programming typically beginning at 6 PM. Special discounted admission rates apply after 4 PM.

As the sun sets the desert's nocturnal creatures come alive so a nighttime visit is entirely different from a daytime visit. The popular Summer Saturday Evening program showcases what happens in the desert after dark and how plants and animals adapt. Many animals are more active at night – especially beavers, mountain lions, and small cat predators.

Experience the Sonoran Desert celestial wonders complete with a cacophony of nighttime sounds, fluorescent minerals, night pollinators, and more.
