



Nature Art Certificate Program



iscover your talent as an artist or work in the studio for fun, while you enjoy the surroundings at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum. The Art Institute program offers individual classes as well as a certificate of completion program in nature art. The unique backdrop of the Museum becomes your classroom, while you have the option of drawing birds, mammals, insects and desert botanicals. You can also participate in a wide

including oil painting, nature journaling, mixed media and photography.

Experienced, professional artists provide individual instruction in the classroom setting located in the museum's Baldwin Education Building. Whether you sample a few classes or complete the certificate program, you will increase your appreciation and knowledge of the desert!

Required Courses

The following 13 courses are required if you wish to receive a Certificate of Completion in Nature Art, and the recommended sequence of courses may vary. If you enroll with previous experience, you may schedule a portfolio appointment with the Director for the possibility of waiving core classes. Elective Courses

Portfolio Review


Upon completion of all coursework, you will be ready for the portfolio review. Call the Art Institute Director for more information (520) 883-3024.




