PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Maguey

Agave subsimplex

DESCRIPTION: This is a small, broad-leafed century plant. An individual rosette will become no more than a foot or so across. It spreads into a clump by pupping. The beautiful leaves are banded gray and chalky green. A head will not bloom for at least 12-15 years, sending up a small inflorescence to around 10' high. That head will later die, but the clump of pups will live on. Maguey is native to very dry regions of the northern coast of Sonora, Mexico.

RECOMMENDED USE: Use as a small accent, for its form and leaf color, as a ground cover, in a rock garden, in an enhanced desert landscape or xeriscape, or in a patio container.
