# Texas Bindweed

*Convolvulus equitans*

**DESCRIPTION:** Texas Bindweed is an herbaceous perennial vine native to much of the southwest and northern Mexico. It can be prostrate or twining, arising from a taproot. It is fast growing and treats the gardener to a show of bell-shaped flowers in spring and summer. Blooms are white to pink, at times with a reddish center. Butterflies and native bees visit the flowers.

**RECOMMENDED USE:** Great for a wire fence, a native grass garden, or even a hanging pot.

#### CULTURE:



**Hardiness:** 0°F.



**Sun tolerance:** Full sun to moderate shade.



**Watering and feeding:** Once established it needs little water. Fertilizing is only necessary in containers.



**Soil requirements:** Tolerates most soil.



**Pruning:** Can be cut to 1" to rejuvenate.
