PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Desert Olive *Forestiera shrevei*

DESCRIPTION: Desert Olive is an interesting native shrub found in desert canyons. Small leaves mature to bright green and contrast beautifully with pale gray bark. It is a very drought tolerant, low maintenance plant growing to 6' tall or more. Blooms are tiny and insignificant followed by purplish-black fruit. Birds eat the fruit and use the plant as cover.

RECOMMENDED USE: Desert Olive will provide screening and habitat for wildlife.

CULTURE:

Hardiness: Around 15°F.

Sun tolerance: Full sun to light shade.

Watering and feeding: Drought tolerant after established, but will look better if watered regularly. No fertilizing needed.



Soil requirements: Most soils will do, but it thrives in deep, sandy soil.

Pruning: Any time to shape.
