## Wright's Thimblehead Hymenothrix wrightii

**DESCRIPTION:** Wright's Thimblehead is a biennial or herbaceous perennial in the sunflower family. It grows quickly into a mound a foot or so tall. It is also known as Wright's Beeflowers for its propensity to attract bees to its blooms. Flowers occur in the summer and fall on tall stalks, and are white with a pinkish or lavender hue. It readily seeds into moist areas. Wright's Thimblehead is native in most mountains of Arizona and into Big Bend, Texas and Sonora and Chihuahua, Mexico.

**RECOMMENDED USE:** Great for a rock garden or a pollinator garden.

## **CULTURE:**

Hardiness: At least 15°F.

Sun tolerance: Sun to moderate shade.



Watering and feeding: Low to moderate water once established. Fertilizing not necessary.



Soil requirements: Any soil will do.

Pruning: Cut back after flowering if desired.
